PROGRAM OPTIONS

Lincoln Action Program directly operates a home-based Early Head Start program as well as center-based Full-Day, Full-Year Head Start and Early Head Start programs. Delegate Lincoln Public Schools provides center-based and home-based services through a Part-Day, Part-Year Head Start program in the city of Lincoln, and delegate Wahoo Public Schools offers a Part-Day, Part-Year Head Start program serving Saunders County.


Lincoln Action Program's Early Head Start program serves a total of 140 children. The home-based Early Head Start program option serves 117 of those children. The center-based Full-Day, Full-Year Early Head Start program option serves 23 children and their families at the Lincoln Action Program Head Start Child Development Center.

Lincoln Action Program's Full-Day, Full-Year Head Start program provides services to 52 children at the Lincoln Action Program Head Start Child Development Center. Delegate agency Lincoln Public Schools operates a Part-Day, Part-Year Head Start program which serves a total of 408 Head Start children. Delegate Wahoo Public Schools provides Part-Day, Part-Year Head Start services to 44 children in Saunders County through the operation of Head Start classrooms in Wahoo and Ashland.
